#### SCIS exam results 2016 - PRESS RELEASE

## **Key Findings**

- This year's results from SCIS schools show that 68% of National 5 entries were awarded an A grade (36.5% nationally)
- 92.3% of candidates in a SCIS school sitting Higher achieved a pass of which 55.3% achieved A grade
- 93% of Advanced Higher entries from a SCIS school achieved a pass of which 53.3% gained an A grade

SCIS exam candidates have achieved top grades in this year's exam results with 1 in 6 candidates at a SCIS School achieving three or more A grades at Higher.

## John Edward, Director, Scottish Council of Independent Schools (SCIS) said:

'Scotland can be very proud of the attainment of these pupils and schools – the hard work of young, people, families and teachers. To some, high attainment in the independent sector will come as little surprise. But it is just part of the rounded individual experience on offer – matched by extensive extra-curricular opportunities in sport, music and the arts; as well as personalised guidance on vocational and other life choices.'

In a time of change in education they have shown professionalism and commitment in order to ensure that our pupils realise their full potential. ## **Other Qualifications**

SCIS schools offer their pupils a wide and diverse choice of qualifications. The majority of our schools offer Scottish Qualification Authority exams, however over a third offer alternative exams including: A Levels and International Baccalaureate.

#### A Levels

## Key findings included:

- One in fifteen independent schools candidates achieved 3 A\* at A Level
- Half of ISC entries achieved A\* or A grades at A Level twice the national average

# **International Baccalaureate Diploma**

Candidates of the International Baccalaureate Diploma at SCIS schools consistently perform well-ahead of the world average of **30** points.

'The 2016 IB Diploma results were St Leonards best ever with 85% of Higher Level grades being equivalent to  $A^*/A/B$  grades at A level. This was a great way to celebrate the  $10^{th}$  anniversary of the introduction of the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) at St Leonards, the only school in Scotland with an all-IBDP Sixth Form. We are also celebrating the introduction of the Primary version of the IB in St Leonards Junior School and, as a result the whole school is fizzing with innovation and dynamism from top to bottom – a real  $21^{st}$  century education.'
