Membership Criteria

Schools are required to meet the following criteria:

- 1. The school must be registered with the <u>Registrar of Independent Schools</u> at Education Scotland or in receipt of Grant-Aid
- 2. The School must have had a satisfactory post-registration inspection by <u>Education</u> Scotland
- 3. The School must, if appropriate, have had a satisfactory post-registration inspection by the <u>Care Inspectorate</u>
- 4. Schools must complete an annual census form, by the end of September each year, which SCIS uses to compile its directory of schools and to update school profiles on its website. SCIS also uses the statistical information, in aggregate form only, for publicity and research purposes.

Once an application has been received, staff from SCIS will visit the school, following which a report will be produced which will be sent to the Board of SCIS, and membership will be approved/denied at the first possible board meeting.

Membership Subscriptions

- Given the diversity of schools in membership of SCIS, the fairest way to apply
 membership subscriptions is a fee per pupil, irrespective of the size of school. A
 minimum membership rate also applies.
- The level of subscription is reviewed annually by the Governing Board.
- Because SCIS is a company limited by guarantee and a registered charity, VAT is paid on 40% of the membership subscription.
- Membership subscriptions are due at the start of each calendar year.

Benefits of Membership

SCIS acts as a consultative body for the independent school sector and represents the views and interests of its member schools to the Scottish Government and educational bodies throughout Scotland and beyond. SCIS supports schools in a number of ways:
